Introduction:

World Peace Human Rights Organisation has been consistently working towards spreading awareness on human rights, supporting victims of domestic violence, promoting child rights, empowering women, and fighting against human trafficking. In the year 2022-23, the organisation reached thousands of beneficiaries across Sundergarh and nearby regions through various impactful programs.

Mission & Vision:

Our Mission is to safeguard and promote human rights, ensuring equality, justice, and dignity for every individual. We aim to create awareness, provide support to vulnerable communities, and advocate for policies that strengthen human rights.

Our Vision is to build a society free from violence, exploitation, and discrimination, where human rights are respected and every person can live with dignity and peace.

Programs 2024–25

Human Rights Awareness Program

This program was designed to spread awareness of fundamental rights guaranteed by the Constitution of India. Awareness camps, seminars, and community meetings were organized to empower citizens to fight injustice. Volunteers were trained to provide guidance on legal remedies and support to those facing violations. The initiative reached schools, colleges, and public spaces to ensure wider participation. As a result, more than 3,000 individuals gained knowledge of their rights and responsibilities.



Domestic Violence Program

The organisation worked to provide support and relief to women suffering from domestic abuse. Counseling sessions and legal aid were arranged to help victims gain confidence and seek justice. Awareness campaigns highlighted women's rights under existing laws and protection mechanisms. Training sessions for community volunteers improved early identification and reporting of cases. Around 500 women benefitted through direct support and interventions.

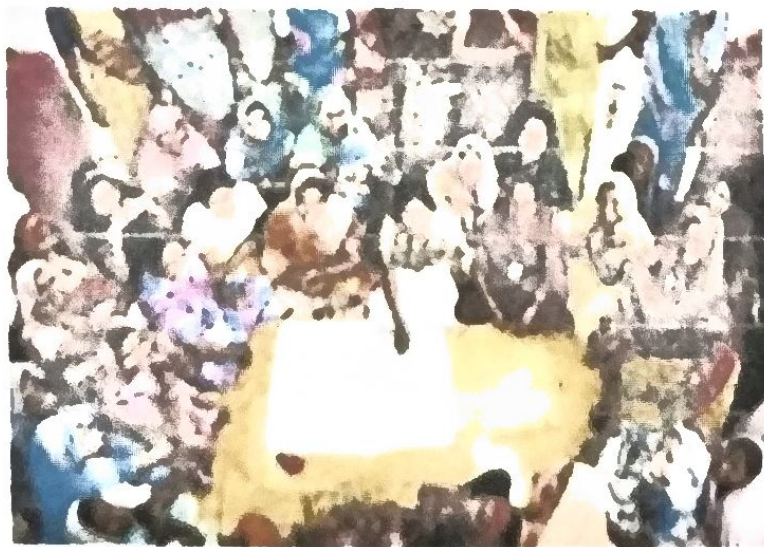


Child Rights Welfare Program

Focused on ensuring that children enjoy a safe, nurturing, and educational environment. Awareness drives were held against child labor, child marriage, and abuse. Community meetings encouraged parents to prioritize education and health for their children. Collaboration with schools helped in identifying at-risk children and providing them assistance. More than 1,200 children benefitted from this initiative, gaining better access to safety and education.

Women Rights Awareness Program

The program aimed at empowering women by informing them of their legal rights and opportunities for growth. Legal literacy camps were conducted to spread awareness on workplace rights, equal pay, and safety measures. Special sessions highlighted laws related to harassment, discrimination, and exploitation. Women were also encouraged to form self-help groups for collective strength. Approximately 800 women actively participated and benefitted from these activities.



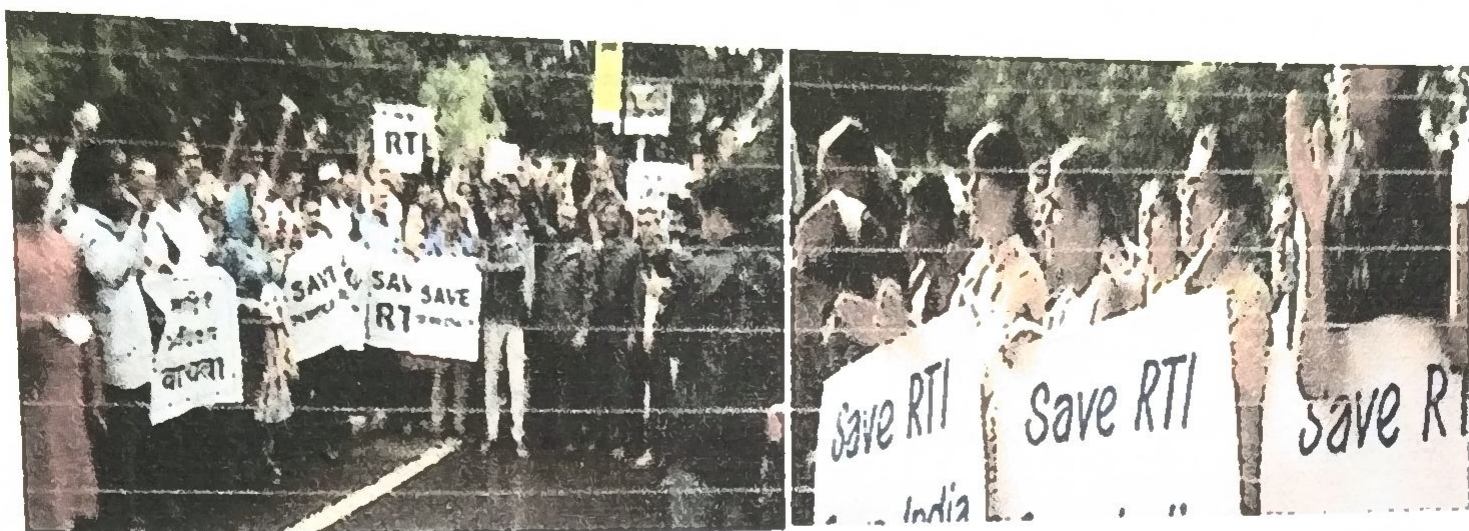
Anti-Human Trafficking Initiative

Human trafficking being a critical issue, the organisation took steps to prevent and combat it at the grassroots. Community vigilance groups were formed to identify suspicious activities and report them. Awareness workshops were held in vulnerable areas to reduce exploitation risks. Rescued victims were given rehabilitation and counseling in partnership with local authorities. The initiative helped prevent potential trafficking cases and created safer communities.



RTI Act Rights Awareness

Citizens were trained to understand and effectively use the Right to Information (RTI) Act. Awareness sessions explained how RTI can ensure transparency in government services and reduce corruption. Practical workshops guided participants on filing applications and following up on responses. Special focus was given to rural communities, enabling them to demand accountability. Over 400 people benefitted and began using RTI as a tool for justice.



Health Awareness Program

This year, a new program was launched to address health issues in rural and urban communities. Awareness drives focused on hygiene, sanitation, maternal health, and preventive healthcare. Free health check-up camps were organized in collaboration with medical professionals. Special attention was given to women and children, promoting immunization and nutritional awareness. More than 2,000 people benefitted, improving overall community health and wellbeing.



Achievements & Impact (2024-25)

- Directly reached more than 6,000 beneficiaries across Sundergarh and nearby districts.
- Built strong partnerships with local administration, schools, and NGOs.
- Encouraged community-led vigilance against social issues.
- Strengthened the voice of vulnerable groups, especially women and children.

Future Goals (2025-26 & Beyond)

- Expand legal aid and counseling services for women and children.
- Strengthen anti-human trafficking networks across Odisha and beyond.
- Start digital literacy and employment training for rural youth.
- Integrate environmental awareness with human rights campaigns.
- Collaborate with national and international organisations for peace and advocacy.
